TRAIL BLAZERS VERSATILE ALL-TERRAIN VEHICLES

All-terrain vehicles (ATVs) are more specialized and sportier than ever. Excellent features once limited to premium ATVs, such as electronic fuel injection and independent rear suspension, are now widespread, and power steering thankfully—has come to the ATV world.

t's become perfectly acceptable if you associate the "V" in ATV (all-terrain vehicle) with versatility. Whether your particular bent is casual trail riding, hunting, farming, camping, exploring or even racing, there are ATVs (also known as quads) that are up to the task. Better, they have more useful features than ever before.

"Covering many bases is important now," says Glenn Hansen of Suzuki. "Our biggest ATV sellers really aren't that far ahead of our other units. That demonstrates that the market is supporting diversity, and [we think it] will continue in that direction."

Good Sports. If you are shopping for an ATV, the first thing you'll notice is they're more fun to drive than the quads of even 3 years ago. Today's engines generate far more power and therefore speed. For the 2008 model year, the size leader is Arctic Cat's ThunderCat utility model. Its 950cc engine delivers a 150cc boost over the off-road king in 2005. "The market isn't lacking in engine performance now," says Russ Brennan of Kawasaki, which offers two 750cc-powered ATVs at the top of its product list. But manufacturers are also giving consumers more features.

One is electronic fuel injection (EFI), which makes for easier starting and much more consistent and stronger engine performance at different altitudes and temperature ranges. In 2005, EFI was offered on

only Polaris' Sportsman 800 Twin EFI and Suzuki's King Quad 700. Now, it's found on at least 20 models. The bad news is you'll find this desirable feature only on models that cost \$7,000 or more.

Independent rear suspension (IRS) is another excellent feature that's becoming more common. IRS means you can have a smoother, faster ride on uneven terrain. On more-performance-oriented machines, this re-

sults in easier-to-control jumps if one rear wheel touches down first than on models that have a straight rear axle.

Happily, IRS can be found on ATVs that are lower in price than those that have EFI, with the Polaris Sportsman 300 4x4 being the low mark at \$4,899.

A sport ATV is the pinnacle in sporty. These quads are built for

speed. Almost all are two-wheel drive, which helps make them lighter—typically up to 300 pounds lighter—than their four-wheel-drive cousins and thus more maneuverable. So, even with smaller engines, sport ATVs are usually faster. They're also better than ever, because manufacturers have introduced features never before seen in the ATV world. For example, Can-Am's new DS 450 has a lightweight all-aluminum chassis that is fabricated with permanent aircraft-style fasteners instead of welds,



which should make it better absorb the pounding it'll receive versus that of typical ATVs.

In the Comfort Zone. ATVing is not all about going fast, though. Of course, sometimes it's about utility. There have been some noteworthy developments on this side of the ATV equation, too.

Fully automatic, continuously variable transmissions (CVTs) are the norm on most utility ATVs (also known as 4x4s) and allow the rider to concentrate

Best Buys in ATVs were based on ease of use, features, performance and reliability. All Best Buys have four-stroke engines and electric start. All have hydraulic disc brakes front and rear, with the exception of the Brute Force and Teryx (each has a sealed, multi-disc rear brake) and Ozark (a mechanical drum rear brake).

All utility ATV and UTV Best Buys have a reverse gear and, like on a car, shaft drive, as opposed to a chain. All utility ATV and UTV Best Buys have continuously variable transmissions (CVTs), except our Economy utility ATV.

All sport ATV Best Buys are single-cylinder, two-wheel-drive models and have five-speed transmissions with manual clutches and a chain final drive.

Suspension travel length is the maximum distance each wheel can deflect vertically. Typically, the higher the measurement, the more responsive the suspension performance. Ground clearance and weight measurement methods differ among manufacturers, but we list them for illustrative purposes.

Because of the variation in price from dealer to dealer and region to region, *Best Price* is an amalgamation of reports collected by National Automobile Dealers Association at press time and is subject to change.

Utility ATVs [P] Kawasaki Brute Force

In play here is the comfortable yet responsive independent rear suspension (IRS) and a powerful but smooth V-twin engine. Dual-density seat foam adds to the comfort level. Many updates grace the Brute Force for 2008, including easier throttle action and an enclosed storage box. Features:

This ATV excels at comfort and carrying capabilities. The IRS and almost pillowy seat provide an extremely comfortable ride. The racks are huge, and the largest cargo compartment (1 cubic foot) in its class resides underneath the front rack. The **Sportsman 500 EFI** (\$6,999), with electronic fuel injection, is also a Best Buy. **Features:**

Like any small two-wheel-drive ATV, this model struggles in deep mud or over big rocks, but everywhere else, it gets plenty of traction. There's no CVT, but this model's



five-speed automatic transmission does the job.

Sport ATVs [P] Can-Am DS 450

List: \$7,499; Best Price: \$6,700 Can-Am succeeded in melding many high-tech performance features into one machine. One example: More mass has been positioned closer to the center of the quad, so the ATV feels much lighter than it is and is thus easier to control during jumps. To get a faster, better handling, lighter sport quad, you'd have to spend over a grand more. And, unless you're highly experienced, you won't notice the difference. The **DS 450 X** (\$8,399), on the terrain rather than gear selection. Know that CVTs are a little more vulnerable in deep-water crossings than conventional manual-shift models, and the drive belt can occasionally slip if water gets in there. But, for overall ease of use, we'll take that trade-off.

Another exciting new feature in ATVs—power steering—was released for the 2006 model year by Honda and Yamaha. Experts tell us this will become an option within 3 years on all utility ATVs above 400cc. Power steer-

ing adds around \$500 to the price, but steering ATVs is much easier with it. Just be aware that you will get less "feedback" through the handlebars. One such "message" that might be missed, for example, is that the ATV might be pulling to one side, because a front tire is going flat. This could mean a damaged wheel rim or a long walk home or both.

Aftermarket accessories (winches, rack extenders, canopies, trailers and d.c. power outlets for lighting and tools,

among others) have been around for some time, but some of these items are now available on production models. We think this is an encouraging trend. For example, Can-Am's Outlander 800 H.O. EFI XT includes a 3,000-poundrated winch, aggressive-tread radial tires on cast-aluminum wheels, heavyduty bumpers and handguards. This model costs \$950 more than the base model, but if you bought the same products in the aftermarket, the price would run at least a couple hundred dollars

with even better shocks and different graphics among other items, is also a Best Buy.

Arctic Cat's model has different bodywork. Although our clone Best Buys are midsize sport machines, larger riders will not feel cramped. The **Suzuki Z400 LE** (\$6,099), with different graphics, is also a Best Buy. **Features:**

Its on-demand all-wheel-drive setup, exclusive to Polaris, engages the front wheels only when the rear wheels start to slip. This saves fuel and limits wear and tear on the front drive.

To keep the price low, Kawasaki uses low-tech hydraulic drum brakes, but they provide all the stopping power needed on this pure-utility UTV. The **Mule 610** (\$6,699), with four-wheel drive, is also a Best Buy.

The UTV (utility vehicle), also known as a side-by-side, remains the ultimate ATV workhorse, because it can haul passengers as well as cargo. Although power steering has yet to enter the market on UTVs-look for it in the next 3 years-most of the other improvements found on utility ATVs are here, too. But perhaps the biggest buzz in UTVs is sportiness. The 2008 modelyear release of Polaris' Ranger Razr marks the debut of the sport UTV. We've found that the Razr's powerful twincylinder engine, low center of gravity and lightweight design allow it to hold its own with conventional sport ATVs when it comes to hammering hard around turns and tackling extremely rough terrain. Will there be more to come? Jeff Henson, senior editor of ATV Illustrated, thinks so, and it would not surprise us to see more of these crossover-like brutes in the coming years.

Smooth Terrain Ahead. What else will ATVing look like in a few years? Would you believe street ATVs are being discussed as a possibility? In most states, ATVs—even those that have been outfitted for the street—are not allowed on public roads. But in Europe, ATVs with street kits are common, and a few small manufacturers make street-capable ATVs for that market. Don Brown, a motorcycle industry analyst, sees this development eventually migrating to the United States.

That's all-terrain versatility for you.

The dense ComfortPillow contains thousands of visco-elastic cushions. It molded gently to the head when we tried it, providing support without feeling hard or rigid.
